




Critical for success

Building conditions to work differently



"Local solutions to local problems - building capacity in the community to respond to their own needs".

"Try, learn, iterate, adapt - Promoting active experiential (and experimental) learning with evidence-driven feedback that allows for real-time adaptation".

"Promoting safe learning environments - Creating (and protecting) safe spaces across organisations and community that encourage experimentation and actively identifying what is working in context".

"Nothing about us without us - Ensuring community voices and lived experience are integrated into all stages of implementation.".

What is different on the ground

- 1. SMBI Listeners monthly newsletters and FACEBOOK page
- 2. PHN commissioned care coordination for families, health services in local schools
- 3. E-Health option (currently being tested)
- 4. new options linked to school readiness and playgroups
- 5. Birthday club established, with parents receiving regular child health information.



Discovery - leading to new challenges and new opportunities

- How might SMBI Listeners Inc. build capability and capacity to grow their presence on the Islands.
- How might the governance and organisational growth of SMBI Listeners Inc., be supported
- How might we strengthen (or build) the skills, practice and infrastructure in place - necessary to drive better health outcomes.



Lessons learned/next steps

There is a need to continue to build a coalition of influential and expert supports around SMBI Listeners Inc. and the collaborative to:

- Continue to expand more broadly the authorising and enabling environment
- Further build capacity and capability of the collaborative regarding design and experimentation
- Engage with private investors and government commissioning bodies to test the approach as an alternative model for commissioning



Lessons learned/next steps

- Build the capacity and capability of SMBI Listeners Inc. as a neutral, local container for change
- Build a longer-term resourcing program to enable continuation of SMBI Listeners Inc., sufficient time for changes in the entity and environment
- Continue to build structural and process capability and practice internally to Brisbane South PHN for this approach.



Lessons learned

- Enabled an environment where the community has an opportunity for greater control and influence over commissioning of services and service design.
- Large investment in community based participatory research to understand issues that are important for families and shared across system providers. Research is continually informing design and experimentation processes.
- Working with local people to build their capacity and capability to be part of the solution and learn how to effectively work with systems to address problems.
