

## Dementia Prevention in Middle-Aged Adults – Exploring the Role for Primary Care

EDUCATION SESSION

In this session we will provide an overview of the current burden of dementia in Australia, potentially modifiable risk factors for dementia and the role of primary healthcare in reducing dementia risk.

We will also introduce a new clinical trial that is currently recruiting primary care clinics, that is investigating two interventions for assessing dementia risk and reducing dementia riskfactors in middle-aged adults.

SPEAKERS: **Professor Dimity Pond** is a general practitioner and honorary professor, Discipline of General Practice, University of Newcastle. She has explored GP management of dementia through a number grants and continues to educate GPs about it through involvement with Dementia Training Australia.



Professor Parker Magin is a general practitioner; Conjoint Professor, Discipline of General Practice, University of Newcastle; and Director of Research and Evaluation, GP Synergy. As well as his educational research into GP training, his main clinical research interests are TIA and stroke, and cognition and medicines use in older patients.
