He is a past chair of the RACGP Specific Interests Group of Pain Management and is a Conjoint Lecturer, School of Medicine and Public Health, University of Newcastle. He has authored opinion pieces, research



papers and guidelines on the management of pain, addiction and psychoactive pharmaceuticals in general practice as well as the evaluation of related education for GPs.

Emma has 15 years' experience working in partnership with health services to implement strategies that support the routine provision of preventive care to patients. Emma's recent work as part of her PhD supported clinicians working in maternity services within the Hunter New England Local Health District to improve their provision of antenatal care addressing alcohol consumption. The initiative was found to be effective in increasing the



proportion of women receiving recommended care and in turn reduced special occasion drinking during pregnancy.
