With 46 years practicing medicine, he is currently developing the area of Infant and Toddler Neuropsychiatry with a view to early intervention to prevent or ameliorate autism and intellectual disability together with the early diagnosis of FASD and traumatic brain injury. He is part of a research group looking at helping families with children with dementia and other severe life limiting disorders.
