BACKGROUND


- ➤ Federal Government funding announced in May 2023 under *Building a Stronger Medicare* package
- ➤ PHNs to commission locally designed Multidisciplinary
 Teams (MDTs) to support ACCHS and
 small/solo general practices in the management of
 chronic diseases
- > 3-year pilot to June 2027



PROGRAM AIM

The aim of the MDT pilot program is to:

- ➤ Utilise the skills of the multidisciplinary team to improve patient outcomes, reduce complications and reduce avoidable chronic disease related hospitalisations.
- Support GPs in the management of chronic conditions



MULTIDISCIPLINARY TEAM (MDT)

Multidisciplinary teams involve multiple health professionals from several different disciplines who care, collaborate and communicate together to provide comprehensive care for the patient/client.


Key elements of an effective MDT include:

- **Diverse expertise:** health professionals from different disciplines that utilise their unique knowledge and skills
- Shared goals: working together toward common goals for the patient
- Collaborative approach: effective communication, shared clinical review, problem solving and decision making
- Client Centred: the focus remains on the Client's needs, preferences and goals
- Coordinated Care: MDT members coordinate efforts to reduce fragmentation, avoid duplication and improve the patient experience

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PILOT LOCATIONS AND HEALTH NEEDS

- ➤ The MDT program will be piloted in **two** identified priority locations in the HNECC region
- ➤ The MDT in each location will be based on locally identified health needs
- > Priority locations identified and prioritised using:
 - Chronic disease rates
 - Barriers to accessing care
 - Social disadvantage
 - Underserviced populations (workforce)
- > Health needs identified and prioritised using:
 - > PHN Data
 - > Lumos Data
- Local Consultation with GPs



PILOT LOCATION - MOREE

> Chronic disease target: Diabetes

➤ In scope: Type 1 Diabetes, Type 2 Diabetes, LADA

➤ Not in scope: Pre-diabetes






PILOT LOCATION - MUSWELLBROOK

- > Chronic disease target: Respiratory diseases
- ➤ In scope: COPD, Severe Asthma, Cystic

 Fibrosis, Pulmonary Fibrosis, Bronchiectasis, P

 neumoconiosis
- ➤ Not in scope: Mild Moderate Asthma





ELIGIBLE DISCIPLINES

Disciplines that can be commissioned to form part of the MDTs include:

- > Allied health professionals
- Nurses including Diabetes Educators, Nurse Practitioners
- Aboriginal health workers/practitioners
- > Assistant health workers (i.e. Allied health assistants)

Services that cannot be commissioned as part of the MDT include:

- General Practitioners,
- > Dental Health Workers, and
- Administration staff



COMPOSITION OF THE MDT

- Designed to address the needs of each community
- > Deliver evidence based clinical interventions
- Improve chronic disease management, reduce complications and avoidable hospitalisations
- > Minimum of two different health disciplines



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MDT SERVICE MODEL

- > MDTs will work across practices
- > Services will be available face to face
- > Services will target vulnerable population groups
- > MDT will have strong links to general practice
- > MDT case conferencing desirable
- > Awareness of LHD initiatives
- > Links to other PHN commissioned services





MDT COMMISSIONING

- Partnerships encouraged for MDT Pilot Model
- ➤ MDT Budget available when request for proposal is issued.
- > PHN will look to commission organisations who are already operational in our footprint.
- > Services should commence in Feb 2025.
- > Confirm Tenderlink registration details with PHN.
