- Individual consultations for patients newly diagnosed with type 1 and type 2 diabetes
- Individual consultations for conversion to insulin therapy
- Individual insulin and self-management education
- Individual instruction for self-care activities.

- Individual consultations and group education for gestational diabetes
- Young People's Clinic and Transition clinic
- Insulin Pump Commencement

Who should I refer to GNS DIABETES SERVICE

Appropriate referrals would be:-

- New diagnosis Type 1, 2, GDM or prediabetes
- CFRD (Cystic Fibrosis Related Diabetes)
- Newly starting insulin
- Change to treatment
- Assistance with blood glucose monitoring
- Unstable glycaemic control (ie significant hypo/ hyperglycaemia)
- Poor glycaemic control
- Patients using insulin pumps
- Cognitive or dexterity issues influencing self care



When making referral



Need adequate information to prioritize

- Patients name, ward and MRN
- Type of diabetes
- New diagnosis or known
- Treatment new or established
- Reason for referral
- Discharge plan- timeframe
- Diabetes Clinician to clinician referral form
