## A GP's observations


- Tsunami of Omicron >90% of all cases usually mild disease
- Majority managed by self care
- RAT +ve or PCR +ve = COVID-19 positive
- Date of +ve test = Day 0
- Deisolation midnight Day 7 (as long as symptoms resolved)
- If symptomatic & RAT –ve then perform a PCR
- From 12/1/22 RAT +ve must be reported via Service NSW App
- \$1000 fine for not reporting (threat of the fine is the "stick")
- No further contact tracing
- Workforce in crisis Furloughing of HCW
- Booster shots are the best offering we have to reduce the risk of severity of infection against all strains of COVID-19 including Omicron

# Rapid Antigen Tests (RAT)

- RAT self reporting via Service NSW App or Website form 12/1/2022
- ALL new cases with an Onset date in the last 7 days will now get the Self-managed SMS (no longer based on criteria)
  - Exceptions: patients admitted as Inpatient or to SHA
- This includes cases confirmed by PCR and RAT
- De-isolate SMS will now go out on Day 1. That is, just after midnight the day following their positive result. The de-isolation date is still after 7 days.

## Medibank triage process

- A new list (for use by Medibank staff) **COVID-19 Secondary Referral List** shows all RAT cases. Those flagged as Indeterminate risk will be triaged by Medibank and referred to LHDs if follow up is required.
- This process to commence soon date TBA



## PCR or RAT?

### **POSITIVE RAT | What do I need to do next?**

You do not need to have your rapid antigen test (RAT) confirmed with a PCR unless you are:

- pregnant (more than 20 weeks)
- Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander
- unvaccinated (16+ years)
- immunosuppressed
- a worker, resident, patient, or client in a high-risk setting
- asked to by a registered medical practitioner

## Performing a RAT in General Practice

- Why? for all procedures or consults deemed to last >15 minutes
  - eg Long skin checks, IUD insertions, skin excisions, FTF counselling
  - Patients with respiratory symptoms/ Covid symptoms assessed and examined and swabbed outside of practice eg in carpark, dedicated area in practice, demountable

(GP dressed in full PPE)

- Patient performs own test, instructed by GP
- Result within 10-15 minutes
- If RAT negative & symptomatic perform a PCR
- Patient pays for RAT at cost to cover practice cost

# Central Coast Covid Community Support Team (CCST)

CCST will receive notification of all moderate to high risk positive patients from NSW Health triage system (Medibank Triage Process)

# Central Coast Covid Community Support Team (CCST)

- Contact with the moderate to high risk patients
- Identify those who meet criteria for Sotrovimab (effective against Omicron)
  - Given in Infusion clinics in APAC Tues & Fri and soon to be Wed
  - Given in ED
- Oximeters couriered to letterbox or doorstep pick up and return
- Provide medication packs:
  - Adult: Salbutamol, Budesomide 200ug puffer, Paracetamol, Ibuprofen
  - Kids: Salbutamol & Spacer, Paracetamol, Ibuprofen, Hydralyte
- 5-10 patients a week from GPs in last 2 weeks
- Moderate to high risk includes children <3/12 (soon to be <1/12), chronic disease, immunosuppression, PREGNANCY, First Nation
