Corresponding RACGP advice for general practices

- NSW Health has introduced a "traffic light" system to help people understand the current level of community transmission and the appropriate response regarding infection-control strategies.
- Given the current level of local transmission, NSW Health has advised its local health districts to escalate to a
 moderate risk level (amber). This means that:
 - all NSW Health workers must wear a surgical mask if they are within 1.5 m of patients.
 - patients are also required to wear a mask, when possible.
- The RACGP:
 - supports the new directive from NSW Health for all healthcare workers to wear a face mask when physical
 distancing of 1.5 m is not possible. This realistically applies to all face-to-face consultations, regardless of
 symptoms.
 - advises that wearing a mask supplements, but is not a substitute for, other precautions such as hand hygiene and
 physical distancing.

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PHN Overview

PPE requirements

Masks – deliveries underway to orders. Adequate supply Alternate suppliers list for other items – gloves, gowns, faceshields etc Purchased equipment to enhance supplies in stock – gowns, faceshields

RACF preparation

Direct contact by PHN, or LHD teams to reinforce preparedness, plans, supplies, training

Outbreaks – one off grants to enhance access to local GPs to support increased testing
