

Timelines

Define your project timelines.

Do your timeframes allow you to plan and implement the right type of engagement activities?



Context

Understand your project context.

What is the background and history that has led to this point?




Scope

Define the scope of the decision(s) to be made.

What influence can the community have on the decision?


What is negotiable or non-negotiable?



Purpose

What is the purpose of your engagement?

What are you trying to achieve and what will your outcomes be?



Stakeholders

Identify and involve all relevant people.

What level of interest and influence will your stakeholders have in your project?

Level of Engagement

Determine the IAP2 Spectrum - level of engagement you will be working at.

What is your promise to the community?





Methods

Choose your engagement methods.

Consider the scale, duration and engagement context of your project.





Communications

Develop key messages.

What do you want people to know and do?

How will you show that their feedback has informed the final decision(s)?





Risk Analysis

Where do the engagement risks lie within your process?

How will you mitigate these risks?





Monitor and Evaluate

Monitor your engagement and respond quickly if something needs to change.

At the end of the project the evaluation will help identify what worked well or didn't work well.





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
